The cost of a convex mirror would be between £25 and £60, it was agreed that we would wait for Caroline's return before progressing but could see no reason why we should not progress this. 7.	<p>Planning</p> <p>7.1 No new applications this month, but following a complaint and open discussions with local residents it was agreed that Doug would raise the issue yet again with Shepway and that a petition is raised to show the feeling of the local residents regarding the White House Land site which is constantly breaching conditions imposed by the Planning Inspectorate Bristol. The continued use of caravans for residential use at Martins Farm would also be raised with the District Council. It was suggested that these sites may well contribute to a devaluation of properties within the area and that this feeling is made known to the District Council.</p>	DS
8.	<p>Correspondence</p> <p>8.1 Two items of correspondence had been received, one regarding local road closures and the other about Marie Curie cancer research, both items were place on the table in the village hall and a poster placed on the notice board</p>	
9.	<p>Any Other Business</p> <p>9.1 It was noted that attendance at this meeting was unusually high due to the discussions around the village sign; the members of the public were thanked for their attendance and were encouraged to participate more often in the Parish Council meetings.</p> <p>9.2 Doug mentioned that as a result of his intention to stand down as Chairman from spring 2012, the parish council would only be quorate if all members of the council attended the meetings; it was difficult enough already to get all 4 members together on a monthly basis. As we are running with one person less on the council at the moment, he invited anyone interested in becoming a councillor to come forward and join the Council.</p> <p>9.3 It was suggested by members of the public that a generic e-mail should be sent out containing the minutes and agenda for the next meeting, this would help people know what was going on in the village. Doug supported this approach but asked who would be responsible for the control of this action every month; he also stated that the minutes and agendas were posted on the notice boards for everyone to see. Andy said that he would try to communicate the agendas to the e-mails that he would collect after this meeting.</p> <p>9.4 It was suggested that the Parish Councils web site is updated with the agendas and minutes, but as this had been used against the Parish Council previously for not updating the site early enough and that</p>	AD

	<p>there is no requirement for the Parish Council to do this, we would consider this action as and when we have time and people trained to the KCC requirements, at present only Doug is trained.</p> <p>9.5 It was suggested that the millennium bench currently housed in the village hall should be placed on the green or in the church area. The parish council would discuss this further.</p> <p>9.6 During discussions on the positioning of the millennium bench it was suggested that the Parish council consider the purchase of a Bike stand to be placed outside the church. This could be discussed further when a decision is made on the location of the bench.</p> <p>9.7 Doug raised the fact that without volunteers to run the Ivychurch Amenities Association he proposed to close the charity at the end of the financial year, (Dec 2011). The IAA had only been kept running for the past year so that funding could be sought for the Village sign and for new Play equipment.
